DEPARTMENT 10

4-H AND VOCATIONAL

Eligibility: 4-H club members must have passed their eighth birthday but must not have passed their 19th birthday as of Jan. 1st. Exhibitors must be 4-H members carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make entry and be under the supervision of their State University Cooperative Extension Service by their designated deadline. Open Class rules, regulations and entry times apply for all 4-H and Vocational Livestock Projects. Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. For exhibits, including live animals, please refer to the Beaver County 4-H Project Directory and/or the project book for project completion requirements not listed on the website or department 10 information printed from the website. **EXHIBITORS MAY NOT SHOW IN BOTH DEPARTMENT 10 AND DEPARTMENT 9.**

Note: Entry fees will not be charged for 4-H entries, only when the animal has been entered in open or youth classes.

Section A-9 – BREEDING RABBITS

1. **Eligibility:** 4-H club members must have passed their eighth birthday but must not have passed their 19th birthday as of Jan. 1st. Exhibitors must be 4-H members or FFA members carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make entry and be under the supervision of their State University Cooperative Extension Service or Beaver County FFA Chapter by June 1st or they must exhibit in Dept 11 Youth Rabbits.

2. No rabbit may compete in more than one class.

3. Each exhibitor will be limited to no more than a total of **FOUR entries** in the 4-H Department or **FOUR entries** in the Youth Department. **Rabbits are to arrive on Monday, August 22 between 1pm and 6pm in the Rabbit Barn.**

4. All rabbits shown by a 4-H exhibitor must be owned by that exhibitor and at least one rabbit must be carried as a 4-H project.

5. **Exhibitors should wear a show coat or apron with a white long-sleeved shirt and black pants, or skirt are preferred. Shoes should be totally enclosed. No long earrings, only studs. No bracelets or watches. If the exhibitor's hair is long enough to fit in a ponytail or braid, it should be pulled back.**

6. Due to limited space, all entries must be pre-registered by July 15th. All rabbit entries will be accepted in the order they are received according to their postmark until all pens are filled. If a 4-H member doesn't get a pen their project can be completed by entering a poster in the fair. If an animal to be exhibited becomes sick, a refund may be granted, or it may be replaced by another rabbit if a slip is obtained from a vet.

7. **RABBIT EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR OWN FEED AND CARE OF THEIR ANIMALS THE WEEK OF THE FAIR. ONLY BEDDING WILL BE PROVIDED.**

8. Animals must remain in cages at all times while on exhibition, except during judging.

9. Classes 100 through 400 will be judged as grade stock. Classes 600 through 900 will be judged as registered stock. Registered stock must have registration papers, tattoo or letter from breeder stating that the rabbit is from registered stock.

DEPARTMENT 11 — YOUTHS UNDER 19

1. **Eligibility:** Youth ages 18 years old and under as of January 1st, other than 4-H and FFA members, to provide everyone a chance to participate at the fair. Rabbits shown in Department 10 as a 4-H rabbit project may not be shown in Department 11 Youth.
2. No rabbit may compete in more than one class.
3. Each exhibitor will be limited to no more than a total of **FOUR entries** in Department 11 Youth Rabbits. Example of 4 entries: One young doe, one young buck, one adult buck, one mother and litter. **Rabbits are to arrive on Monday, August 23 between 1pm and 6pm in the Rabbit Barn.**
5. Due to limited space, all entries must be pre-registered by July 15th. All rabbit entries will be accepted in the order they are received according to their postmark until all pens are filled. If an animal to be exhibited becomes sick, a refund may be granted or it may be replaced by another rabbit if a slip is obtained from a vet.
6. **RABBIT EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR OWN FEED AND CARE OF THEIR ANIMALS THE WEEK OF THE FAIR. ONLY BEDDING WILL BE PROVIDED.**
7. Animals must remain in cages at all times while on exhibition, except during judging.
8. Classes 100 through 500 will be judged as grade stock. Classes 600 through 1000 will be judged as Pedigree stock. Pedigree stock must have registration papers, tattoo or letter from breeder stating that the rabbit is from Pedigree stock.

Rabbit Health Rules and Requirements

All animals showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious or parasitic diseases will not be admitted to any show or other fair event.

All drug and vaccine labels directions must be followed, including but not limited to milk and slaughter withdrawal periods. The vaccine must be administered at least 15 days prior to entry into the fair.

Pennsylvania Rabbits Requirements:

1. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases.
2. An *Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinarian-Client-Patient Relationship* (VCPR) statement for the animals being exhibited must be included on the fair registration form.

Out of State Rabbits Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 60 days prior to the opening date of the exhibition is required.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI (the statement is pre-printed on the CVI).
3. Must follow PDA import requirements if coming from a state in which Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) has been diagnosed within the last twelve months and if so will require a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection with specific requirements and statements added. In addition, feed, trailers, forages, tack, or materials associated with known affected rabbits or premises may not enter the commonwealth. This CVI requirement does not apply to rabbits coming from states where RHD has not been diagnosed within the last 12 months.
