(Revised November 2022)

Pennsylvania Code of Conduct And Behavioral Expectations

Members participating in or attending club, county, regional, district, state, and national programs, activities, events, shows, and contests sponsored for youth by the Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc. are required to conduct themselves according to the Pennsylvania Member Code of Conduct and Behavioral Expectations. The code and expectations operate in conjunction with the rules and regulations of the specific activity.

Volunteer Leaders attending or participating in the above-mentioned activities are expected to conduct themselves according to the Pennsylvania Volunteer Code of Conduct and Behavioral Expectations and to assist and support youth in their efforts to adhere to the Pennsylvania Member Code of Conduct and Behavioral Expectations.

Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc. Dress Guidelines

Knowing what to wear at events is sometimes a challenge. The dress code at County events such as club meetings, picnics, dinners, banquets, field trips, shows, activities during the shows, etc. Members not wearing appropriate dress will be required to change.

Casual: Jeans, khakis, t-shirts, walking shorts (figure tip length or longer) are appropriate. This is what you would wear to club meetings or picnics. Not appropriate casual clothing: cut-offs; badly worn jeans; t-shirts depicting drug, alcohol or sexually oriented slogans; tube tops; tank tops with straps smaller than 2 inches; and strapless or backless shirts, & no oversize, sagging pants.

Professional Casual: For guys- Slacks or khakis, polo shirts, collared shirts (ties not required). For ladies- Skirts (fingertip length or longer) or dress slacks including khakis with blouse or sweater; or dresses (at least fingertip length, not strapless or backless). Professional casual clothing maybe appropriate for club banquets, dinners.

Dress-up: For Gentlemen – Dress slacks with collared shirt and tie, jacket or sweater (no jeans). For Ladies – Dresses (at least fingertip length, not strapless or backless), suits or pantsuits.

At All Times: No undergarments may be exposed or prone to exposure. No midriff areas may be exposed or prone to exposure. Pajamas, loungewear, or other sleep wear should not be worn in public area.

Dress Code for Shows and Sale:

Market Show: Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc T-Shirts, **No hats or cell phones**

Showmanship Show: Button Down short or long sleeve dress shirt, **No hats or cell phones**

Sale: Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc. Polo Shirts

Shirts are to be tucked into jeans or khaki pants. Pants are to be neat and have no holes or tears in them.

Beaver County Livestock Program Rules

1. Club members must be enrolled in a livestock project, attend the October organizational meeting, and commit themselves to the type and number of projects at this meeting. **Changes made after the October meeting must be brought to the Board of Directors for approval.** These rules will be reviewed and/or amended annually (by majority vote) of the membership of the BCSCI and the BCSCI Board of Directors. Changes to these rules must be read or reviewed at a mandatory Parent\Kids meeting of the BCSCI. Then they may be voted on by the membership for either approval or disapproval.
2. Club rules state that a club member must be seven (7) years of age before January 1 of the current year but must not have passed his or her 21st birthday by January 1 of the current year.
3. Members must attend at least 50% (5 of 9 meetings) of the regular livestock club meetings to be eligible to show and sell their projects. Members must be present for 75% of the meetings to be credited for attendance at that meeting. **Excuses for absence must be approved by the Board of BCSCI.** A responsible adult must accompany member(s) between the ages of 7 and 15 years old to each meeting.
4. Projects accepted for show and sale may be limited to space available at the show.
5. Projects must be on feed, weighed, and properly identified (tagged) by the species weigh-in date. Animals must be housed where they can receive daily care by the member to be eligible to be shown and sold at the show.
6. A responsible adult must accompany member(s) project(s) to all weigh-ins. This person or the member will complete Weigh-In slips in triplicate. If project is housed at a different location other than the members address it must be noted on the weigh-in form. Once completed and the animal is weighed and tagged, the member and his/her family will have ten(10) days from the date of weigh-in to make any corrections on the weigh-in entry form.
7. All male animals must be castrated except for Poultry. Female hogs, lambs, poultry and goats will be accepted as market projects in the Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc. It is strongly recommended that all hogs, lambs, goats, and steers be castrated and healed before the weigh-in date. **Animals MUST be castrated & Steers must be Dehorned BEFORE weigh-in.**
8. **Steers:** Only beef breed calves will be accepted. It is recommended that steers for show be born between January and May, of the current weigh-in year. Weigh-in date is Saturday before Thanksgiving. Weigh-in weight may not exceed 750 pounds. Suggested weight range is 400-750 pounds. Time: 8 AM – 10AM
9. **Lambs:** Weigh-in date: First Saturday in May. Time: 8AM – 10AM. It is recommended that the Lambs be born **February – March**, of the current weigh- in year. Weigh – in weight may not exceed 90 pounds. Suggested weight range is 45 – 85 pounds. Ideal weight at weigh- in is 60 pounds. All lambs must have a scrapie ID prior to weigh- in. If scrapie tag is lost the member has to contact the breeder.
10. **Swine:** Weigh- in date: First Saturday in May. Time: 8 AM – 10 AM. It is recommended that the hogs be born in **February** of the current weigh-in year. Suggested minimum weight range is 40 - 85 pounds. Ideal weight at weigh-in is 60 pounds.
11. **Goats:** Weigh – in date: First Saturday in May. Time: 8 AM – 10 AM. It is recommended goats should be born **January - February** of the current weigh-in year. Suggested weight range is 40-50 pounds. (Meat goats only) All goats must have scrapie ID prior to weigh-in. If scrapie tag is lost the member must contact the breeder.

12. **Meat Rabbit pen:** Only New Zealand or Californian breed or Crossed breed of these 2 breeds will be accepted. Pen must consist of 3 rabbits. Weight of the pen may not exceed 25 pounds. Rabbits must be 8 to 12 weeks old, and the pen must weigh 12-25 pounds. If the rabbits are not bred by the youth we will have a pool of rabbits to get them from.

13. **Turkeys:** This project is one (1) Tom turkey. All turkeys will be from the same turkey pool. All turkeys must be paid for in full when the order is placed. Turkeys will be delivered to Beaver County in 18 to 20 weeks before the show depending upon availability. It is suggested to purchase a few extra birds due to their fragility.

14. **Poultry Pen:** All project entries will consist of a minimum of 10 birds. A pen of three (3) hens will be exhibited at the show. All birds must be paid in full when the order is placed. Birds will be delivered to Beaver County in 10-12 weeks before the show depending upon availability.

15. **To be eligible to show and sell at the sale, the minimum and Maximum weights are:**

Steers..... 920-1500 lbs.

Poultry Pen.....20-40 lbs.

Lambs.....90-160 lbs.

Hogs.....200-310 lbs.

Goats.....60-125 lbs.

Turkeys.....18-55 lbs.

Rabbits.....12-25

Steers: Recommended Weigh is 1,325 Pounds

Lambs: Must be Slick Shorn before August Weigh - in

Hogs: Recommended Weigh is 280 lbs.

Goats: Must be shaved before August Weigh – in

All animals must be marketable quality as determined by the Board of Directors of the Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc.

16. All animals will be subject to the Executive Board.

17. Market and Breeding projects must be shown by their owner except when the member has more than one animal in a class; **or if the Club member has to be at College, Service or a legitimate reason.** Then the additional animal or animals may be shown by another Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc. member.

18. **A.** The following constitutes a Farmyard project:

a. One (1) Steer

b. Two (2) Lambs (wethers or ewes)

c. Two (2) Hogs (barrows or gilts)

d. Two (2) Goat (Does or wethers have to born after Jan 1)

B. The following constitutes a Backyard project:

a. Three (3) Hens

b. Three (3) Rabbits

c. One (1) Turkey

C. Members are allowed Four (4) projects which are limited to:

Four (4) Backyard projects, in any combination not to exceed two projects per any species.

Three (3) Farmyard projects and One (1) Backyard project.

Two (2) Farmyard projects and Two (2) Backyard projects.

One (1) Farmyard project and Three (3) Backyard projects.

A maximum of Two (2) projects per any One (1) species

D. Experienced members are allowed to exceed these project limits by board approval and barn space available.

19. **At the Show animals will shown by weight only.**

20. All Steers must be trained to lead with a halter and have a controllable disposition. Animals with an uncontrollable disposition will have to leave the show. For any steer not having a suitable rope halter at loading time following the sale, a \$12.00 fee will be deducted from the member's check.

21. **THIS IS A PUBLIC AUCTION. ALL MARKET PROJECTS ARE TERMINAL PROJECTS AND ALL MARKET PROJECTS WILL BE SOLD AT THE AUCTION.**

22. FEED: Exhibitors must provide their own grain, hay, buckets and troughs.

23. A 3% commission will be deducted from the gross sale of each animal and deposited into the Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc. treasury.

- A \$1.00 Beef check-off fee will be deducted from the gross sale of each steer and forwarded to the Pennsylvania Beef Council P O Box 6159, Hermitage, PA 16148.
- A .004% Pork check-off fee will be deducted from the gross sale of each Hog and forwarded to the National Pork Producers Council, PO Box 10383, Des Moines, IA 50306
- A .007 cent per pound check-off fee will be deducted from the sale of each Lamb and forwarded to Lamb Promotion, Research & Information Program, 23029 Network Place, Chicago, IL 60673-1230

THE ABOVE-MENTIONED COMMISSIONS OR CHECK-OFFS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

24. **Only exhibitors will be permitted in the ring while the Show is in progress. No coaching is to be given from outside the ring as this tends to distract and confuse the exhibitor.**

25. **During the Show Week, FITTING MUST BE DONE ONLY BY THE EXHIBITOR, FAMILY MEMBER, VOLUNTEER LEADER, OR OTHER BEAVER COUNTY MEMBER OF THE SAME CLUB.**

26. **Unethical Fitting-** Any animal showing any evidence of unethical fitting practices, such as tampering with the natural fleshing and muscle development, and drenching, will be barred from the show.

27. **If an animal loses an ear tag or leg band, Club Leaders must be notified immediately. A new tag or leg band must be placed in the animal's ear or leg only by a Leader.**

28. Any tampering or any unethical practices related to animals identification will result in disqualification of the animal and member.

29. Exhibitors must not sleep or loiter at night in the buildings or livestock areas on the grounds during the Fair unless given permission by the Club's Board of Directors.

30. Livestock club members are required to participate in club activities (show & sale), including fund-raisers, and to complete their project book. Members who do not participate in club activities and who do not complete their project and record books are not eligible to enroll in the Beaver County Stockman's Club, Inc.

the following year. Members must sell a minimum of \$75 of ads for the ad book or a \$75 fee will be deducted from the member's check.

31. All members must participate in both set up days and must help with clean up after the fair or a \$50.00 fee will be deducted from their project check.
32. The Board of Directors of each club reserves the final and absolute right to interpret all rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard to or otherwise arising out of or connected with the livestock club.
33. Showmanship: The member MUST show his/her own animal in the showmanship classes. Showman-ship is judged on how well YOU work with YOUR animal. Exceptions, to this rule will be made for market projects members at their club show whose animal didn't make weight or were unable to come to the show.
34. Each member is responsible for feeding, watering and caring for their animal(s) show week until Saturday after the show and they are taken to be processed. Animals must independently consume feed and water. **NO FORCE FEEDING IS PERMITTED. All animals must be fed & pens cleaned every day of the fair by 10 am.**
35. Animals consigned for slaughter during or immediately following the show shall not receive any treatment with drugs or biologics within the withdrawal time prior to slaughter. Withdrawal times for drugs and biologics are all stated on the directions for use. Label directions must be followed at all times. If upon slaughter, treatment with drugs, biologics, or any chemical from fitting products, is the condemnation of a carcass, loss of the carcass and any other damages will be borne by the exhibitor. No drugs may be administered to animals within thirty (30) days prior to the sale without the approval of a Veterinarian.
36. Stall cards size (11x14) will be used to thank your buyer(s) and/ or supporter(s). Signage at the show will be made in space allotted near the exhibitor's animals.
37. Club Volunteer Leaders will be making species visits for all members. More details concerning species visits will be determined at a later time.
38. When an exhibitor, parent, guardian, leader, coach, or representative acting on behalf of an exhibitor is guilty of unsportsmanlike or unethical conduct, the Board of Directors may require the member to return all trophies and ribbons, and may suspend the member involved from participation in shows or events for such a period as judged appropriate. A parent, guardian, volunteer leader, coach, or representative acting on behalf of an exhibitor, deemed guilty of unsportsmanlike or unethical conduct may also be prohibited from participation in shows or events for such a period as judged appropriate. Persons deemed guilty of un-sportsmanlike conduct may be expelled from the show grounds at the direction of the Board of Directors.

This rule applies at all times during any event, activity, Show and Sale.

Animal Health Requirements

It is the responsibility of the member(s) and his/her parent(s) or guardian(s) to obtain the COMPLETE health requirements from the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture.

When you purchase an animal, check with the breeder and/or owner to see if any shots vaccinations, ect. Have been given to the animal. This will help you maintain and tract your animals health.

DEPARTMENT 5 — SWINE

1. A pen fee of \$5 per head is required with registration. No refunds for no show swine exhibits. If an animal to be exhibited becomes sick a refund may be granted if a slip is obtained from a vet.
2. **Livestock must be pre-registered by AUGUST 1ST.** Swine are to arrive on Sunday, Aug. 20 between 10 p.m. and 6 p.m. They must remain on exhibit until released at 10:30 p.m., Saturday, Aug. 26. Weigh in will be Monday, Aug 21 at 8 a.m.
3. **Exhibitors must read and refer to the Open Youth Market Animal General Rules. Rules 8 through 14 list the limits of market animal projects to be shown and sold. Entries may be limited due to space availability.**
4. NO drenching, pumping or force feeding of liquids will be tolerated except administered by a licensed veterinarian. Violators will be disqualified.
5. Show management will observe the handling of animals both in and out of the show ring and will have the authority to disqualify any exhibitor for unethical practices.

Swine Health Rules and Requirements

All animals showing clinical signs of contagious, infectious, or parasitic diseases will not be admitted to any show or other fair event.

All drug and vaccine labels directions must be followed, including but not limited to milk and slaughter withdrawal periods. The vaccine must be administered at least 15 days prior to entry into the fair.

All market swine exhibited shall move directly to slaughter following the exhibition and may not be diverted to premises other than a recognized slaughter establishment or slaughter market.

Requirements for non-department sponsored shows and events, the role of swine health monitors and veterinarians, holding breeding shows within a 72-hour window and moving breeding swine out before any market swine arrive. A radiofrequency identification tag will be required for all shows and events. The department sponsored market shows will still have to be terminal and be moved directly to slaughter or to a slaughter market in which sales are designated slaughter only sales. The 14-day health paper (CVI) requirement (swine only) remains unchanged.

Pennsylvania Swine Requirements:

Beginning January 1, 2023, no swine species shall be exhibited in Pennsylvania unless each animal:

1. Is accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within 14 days of the fair.
2. Is permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and the ear tag number is recorded on the CVI.
3. Has been visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.

Out of State Swine Requirements:

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued within the 14 days prior to the date of the show is required. The CVI shall include a statement verifying that the swine have not been feed raw garbage.
2. Vesicular Stomatitis (VS) statement: This applies to states that experienced a VS outbreak in the last 12 months. In these cases an accredited veterinarian shall determine whether the animals are free from VS, and animals shall be accompanied by a CVI with the following statement signed by the accredited veterinarian: "All animals identified on this CVI have been examined and found to be free from VS. During the past 90 days, these animals were not located within 10 miles of a site where VS has been diagnosed."
3. All animals must be free of evidence of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this is required on the CVI.

4. Has been visually inspected and found to be free of signs of contagious disease immediately prior to unloading at the exhibition by an accredited veterinarian or swine health monitor appointed by the fair board or livestock show committee.

5. Individual animal ID – must be permanently identified by an official 840 series radio frequency identification (RFID) ear tag and the ear tag number is recorded on the CVI.

6. Brucellosis Testing Requirements:

- No test required if the animal originates from a validated brucellosis-free state or brucellosis-free herd. All others must be tested negative within the 30 days prior to the date of importation.

7. Pseudorabies Testing Requirements:

- Sexually intact swine over 6 months of age shall originate qualified PRV negative herd or be test negative to an official pseudorabies test within 30 days prior to importation.
- No pseudorabies testing is required for all other swine.
