

DEPARTMENT 21 — HOME BREWED

Wine Rules:

1. Entries are limited to one entry per class

2. Exhibitors must 21 years of age or older when produced and a Pennsylvania resident.

3. Wines entered in this department must be amateur wine home produced.

4. Wine may be made from any years grape, fruit or flower. Wine makers will be asked at registration if the grapes or fruit were home grown by the exhibitor. 5. Exhibitors are encouraged to create their own label for the bottle but are not required. The labels are not to include the exhibitors

6. Section 2 you may enter one empty wine bottle to be judged strictly on the creativity of the label. Do not include the exhibitors

name on the label. The name of a personal winery is acceptable.

7. Bottle size needs to be 750 ml for each entry. Bottles need to be corked with a straight neck. No screw on caps will be accepted. Wine bottle capsules are acceptable.

8. Entries will be accepted on Sunday, Aug. 18th ONLY from 1 to 5 p.m. in the Record of Exhibits Office.

9. Judges will open all bottles for tasting during judging. Bottles will be available for pick up on Saturday, August 24th at 10 p.m.

Beer Rules:

1. Entries are limited to one entry per class

2. Exhibitors must 21 years of age or older when produced and a Pennsylvania resident.

3. Beer entered in this department must be amateur beer, home produced under regulations of Part 540 of the Code of Federal Regulatioons.

4. Bottles submitted must be 10 to 14 ounces in volume, brown or green glass, free of raised glass or inked brand name lettering or paper labels. Printer manufacturing codes are acceptable. All bottles must be crown-capped. No swing tops.

5. Corked bottles meeting the above standards are acceptable; however, they must be crown capped over the cork.

6. Homebrew must NOT have been brewed at any place that brews beverages for commercial purpose, including brew-on premises locations.

7. Section 4 you may enter one empty beer bottle to be judged strictly on the creativity of the label. Do not include the exhibitors name on the label. The name of a personal brewery is acceptable. 8. Entries will be accepted on Sunday, Aug. 18th ONLY from 1 to 5 p.m. in the Record of Exhibits Office.

9. Judges will open all bottles for tasting during judging. Bottles will be available for pick up on Saturday, August 24th at 10 p.m.
