1. All products must be made from scratch by the exhibitor within the last calendar year (September 2023 to August 2024). Premiums will not be paid for commercial products.
2. Baked goods must be brought to the fair in or on disposable plates or containers. No glass plates will be accepted. Management will not be responsible for return of plates or containers. Baked products should be packaged in Ziploc bags that can be sealed to protect
against dryness. No baked goods needing refrigeration will be accepted.
3. All baked products entries become the property of the Hookstown Fair and will not be returned to the exhibitor. After judging, the fair may display only a portion of the product for the week.
4. All exhibitors must follow General Rules and Regulations.
5. Only one entry per class per exhibitor will be accepted (including other).

7. Entries will be accepted by the Home Products Committee on Sunday, August 18 from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. in the Commercial Building across from the Main Stage. Judging will take place on Monday, August 19 at 9:00 a.m.
8. The Hookstown Fair has permission to use and edit any photos pertaining to this contest during the Hookstown Fair for promotional purposes.
9. Failure to follow the rules may result in disqualification.
