



DEPARTMENT 15 — HOME PRODUCTS

2023 Entry Rules

1. All products must be made from scratch by the exhibitor within the last calendar year (September 2022 to August 2023). Premiums will not be paid for commercial products.
2. Baked goods must be brought to the fair in or on disposable plates or containers. No glass plates will be accepted. Management will not be responsible for return of plates or containers. Baked products should be packaged in Ziploc bags that can be sealed to protect against dryness. No baked goods needing refrigeration will be accepted.
3. All baked products entries become the property of the Hookstown Fair and will not be returned to the exhibitor. After judging, the fair may display only a portion of the product for the week.
4. All exhibitors must follow General Rules and Regulations.
5. Only one entry per class per exhibitor will be accepted (including other).

ENTRY LOCATION CHANGE - ALL DEPARTMENT 15 HOME PRODUCTS WILL NOW BE ENTERED AND ON DISPLAY IN THE ORANGE TILE BUILDING WHERE FLOWERS AND VEGETABLES ARE LOCATED.

SECTION 1 — BAKED PRODUCTS

Baked products are to be judged on flavor, lightness, general appearance and crumb. Pies are judged on texture of crust and flavor consistency of filling. All baked products must be displayed in disposable containers.

SECTION 2 — CANNED OR DRIED PRODUCTS

1. Canned fruits and vegetables to be judged on quality, general appearance and container.
2. Canned foods must be exhibited in standard Mason-type, clear glass canning jars using a two-piece self-sealing lid (flat discs with metal screw band). Metal screw band must be left on for exhibition because all jars may be opened. All others will be disqualified by the judge.
3. Canned items for exhibit must be canned after last year's fair.
4. Personal names on canning jars will not be accepted. Contents and date may be on label.
5. Only one kind of bean may be entered in each class.

6. ALL CANNED OR JARRED EXHIBITS MAY BE OPENED AT THE DISCRETION OF THE JUDGES.

1. All prior rules and regulations relating to baked products in Department 15 must be followed.
2. Contestants must be residents of Pennsylvania except for the Cupcake Baking Contest which is open to all states.
3. Further rules and requirements may be found on the Hookstown Fair Website under Rules / Classes Special Baking or from Hookstown Fair Board, P.O. Box 33, Hookstown, PA 15050.
4. **Entries in the baking contests may be entered Monday, Aug. 21st from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. Entries will be accepted by the Special Baking Committee located in the bottom of the Grange but put on display in the commercial building across from the Main Stage.**
5. All entries must be displayed in disposable containers. No glass containers will be accepted.
6. All judging will begin at noon on Monday, Aug. 21st.
7. First Place Winner in classes 100 – 400 will be eligible to compete at the 2024 PA Farm Show competition in January.

SECTION 6 — YEAST ROLLS BAKING CONTEST

Sponsored by King Arthur Baking Company

ENTRY TIME ~ Sunday, August 20th 1 p.m. to 5 p.m.
Accepted in the Orange Tile Building
(Department 15)

1. Open to any individual amateur baker (Not just Pennsylvania residents); one entry per person. No Professional Bakers.
2. This contest is NOT part of the PA Farm Show Special Baking Contests.
3. Six yeast rolls of uniform size and shape must be submitted for judging on a disposable plate or pan in a sealed bag. (Any flavor roll can be submitted [white, wheat, rye, ect.]) (All pans, plates and dishes are considered to be disposable and will not be returned.)
4. The yeast rolls must be made from scratch. The exhibitor must use their own yeast roll recipe. The recipe must use King Arthur Flour and specifically named in the recipe. The empty King Arthur Flour Bag must be submitted with the entry as proof of purchase. The recipe for the yeast rolls must be submitted with the entry. It should be submitted on one side of 8 ½ " x 11" paper. Entrant's name, address and phone number must be printed on the back side of the paper. (All recipes will become the property of Hookstown Fair and will not be returned.)
5. Refrigeration is not available at the Fair. Entries that require refrigeration after baking must indicate so in the recipe.
6. Judging Criteria will be based on: Flavor (aroma, taste, good balance of flavorings), Texture (moist and tender crumb, not soggy or dry), Inside Characteristics (even grain, evenly baked, free from air pockets), Outside Characteristics (consistent shape/size/surface, overall appearance).
7. Entries will be accepted by the Home Products Committee on Sunday, August 20 from 1 p.m. to 5 p.m. in the Commercial Building across from the Main Stage. Judging will take place on Monday, August 21 at 9:00 a.m.
8. The Hookstown Fair has permission to use and edit any photos pertaining to this contest during the Hookstown Fair for promotional purposes.
9. Failure to follow the rules may result in disqualification.
